

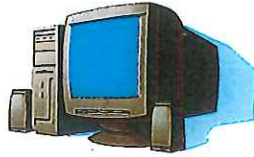
ADDITIONAL RECYCLING OPPORTUNITIES

Large metal items such as appliances, (stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, air conditioners, freezers), can be recycled at the Maplewood landfill by placing them on the concrete apron between the recycling bin and the waste bins at the public access area. Items containing freon (refrigerators, freezers & air conditioners) must have the freon removed by a licensed technician before bringing to the landfill.

Used motor oil, computers, electronics & automotive batteries can also be recycled at the landfill. Check with the main office or security guard.

Tires are accepted at the Maplewood landfill for a fee: passenger tires = \$2.00/tire; tractor-trailer/oversized tires = \$5.00/tire; large agricultural (tractor) tires = \$25.00/tire. Call 561-3004 for an appointment.

Several area automotive businesses also accept used motor oil and automotive batteries for recycling. Call to inquire.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

We operate a permanent HHW collection program at the Maplewood landfill for safe disposal of Amelia County residents' household chemicals. Items accepted include drain cleaners, oven cleaners, spot cleaners, tile cleaners, metal polish, solvents, turpentine, paint thinner, furniture strippers, pesticides, insecticides, pool chemicals, oil based paints & stains, etc. Unacceptable items include smoke detectors, explosives, asbestos, radioactive materials, or infectious wastes. (Note: Latex paint is not hazardous and can be disposed of with your regular trash.)

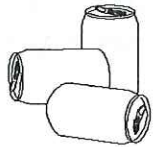
The following materials can be recycled at any of the six trash collection/recycling centers in Amelia County: The Maplewood landfill at 20221 Maplewood Road - public access area open 24 hours/day, 7 days/week.

Remaining sites closed on Sundays & Wednesdays, open 7 to 7 Mondays & Saturdays, 3 to 7 Tuesdays & Thursdays, 11 to 7 Fridays: Pleasant Grove @ 14415 Dykeland Rd; Deatonville @ 7761 S. Genito Rd; Mannboro @ 6701 Namozine Rd; Ponton's Store @ 5141 Ponton's Circle; The old County landfill @ 10200 Epps Lane.

IMPORTANT NOTE

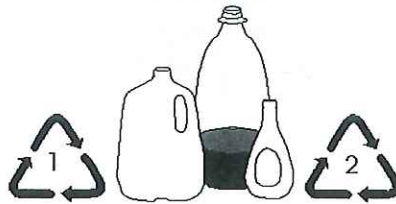
Amelia County now operates a single-stream recycling program. This means that you may collect all of your recyclable materials together and place them in any of the compartments of the Waste Management recycling bins. No sorting required!

ALUMINUM & METAL CANS



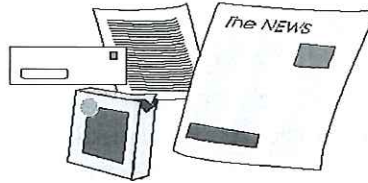
All metal beverage & food containers. Rinse & recycle.

PLASTIC BOTTLES



Plastic **bottles** with a #1 or #2 on the bottom. No plastic bags, buckets, toys, egg cartons, clam shells, food tubs, plant pots, motor oil bottles, etc. Remove caps, rinse & flatten.

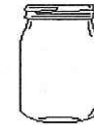
NEWSPAPER & MIXED PAPER



Recycle all daily, weekly & Sunday newspapers & any inserts; junk mail, magazines, catalogs, telephone books, cereal boxes, & cardboard boxes. No waxed paper, tissues, paper towels, plates, or cups or photographs. Break down boxes to conserve space. Paper bags are ok - no plastic bags, please!

Several Amelia churches & non-profit groups also operate Newspaper only recycling bins.

GLASS BOTTLES & JARS



All glass food & beverage containers. No mirrors, light bulbs, ceramic mugs or plates, automobile glass, drinking glasses, pottery, baking dishes or plexi-glass. Remove lids & rinse.

CLOTHES & SHOES

Clothes, shoes and any textiles such as towels, blankets & curtains can be recycled in the white recycling bin marked "CLOTHES & SHOES".

PLASTIC BAGS

Plastic bags can be recycled in special blue bins located at the Maplewood landfill, the Pleasant Grove, Epps Lane, Ponton's Store and Mannboro sites or at Food Lion.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

No Styrofoam, food scraps, candy wrappers, coffee or soft drink cups, straws, motor oil bottles, food contaminated materials, plastic take-out containers & cutlery, mugs, hardback books, food tubs, plastic toys, light bulbs, plant pots, 5 gallon buckets, chip bags, plastic binders.
