

The August 2018 Regular Meeting Synopsis

The August Regular meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Chairman Harris and it was determined there was a quorum. Supervisor Whitaker offered the invocation and everyone joined in the Pledge of Allegiance. The agenda was amended to include a Special Exception Permit. The amended agenda was approved on a motion by Supervisor Whitaker. The minutes for the July Regular Meeting was approved on a motion by Supervisor Gleason. All financial reports were approved on a motion by Supervisor Whitaker.

Matthew Brown spoke during the Public Comments regarding his concern for the water tower cleaning.

David Whitaker reported on activity from VDOT in the County.

The Board approved the 2018 percentage of discount for PPTRA.

The Board also approved support for a Resolution by Mecklenburg County to allow a referendum vote to increase local sales tax.

An amendment to the BPOL ordinance was approved to be published for 2 consecutive weeks for approval at the September Board meeting.

The Board unanimously approved to have the DMV Select in a section of the County Administration Office.

Three Special Event Permits were approved. One was to hold Amelia FrightFest, one to hold a Tractor and Tuck Pull and the last to hold the Homecoming Parade.

During the County Administrator's Report, Taylor Harvie introduced Dr. David Smith as interim School Superintendent and Dr. Reasonor as Assistant School Superintendent. Both thanked the Board and County staff for attending the convocation and looked forward to working with them in the future.

Mr. Harvie reported the host fee check for July was \$35,302.20. Southside Virginia Community College sent their latest newsletter and Commonwealth Regional Council submitted the July Items of Interest.

The July 18, 2018 meeting information for Piedmont Regional Juvenile Detention Center Commission was submitted to the Board and the CRC Regional Reporter for Summer 2018 was submitted to the Board. The Board also was presented with the budget for the tennis court project.

During the Board of Supervisors report Supervisor Scott said he enjoyed attending the ACSB Convocation. Supervisor Harris said he was looking forward to working with the School Board.

With no other business, the August Board of Supervisors meeting was adjourned.
