III. OLD/NEW BUSINESS


Re: COMPREHENSIVE PLAN WORKSHOP

David Whitaker, Community Development Director, discussed the 2016 Comprehensive Plan draft. He explained the Planning Commission's Comp Plan Committee had been meeting regularly for several months. Surveys were sent out and results from those surveys had been instrumental in creating the Comp Plan. He began the interactive workshop and went through each chapter of the Comp Plan and pointed out the highlights.

Comments from the Board and Commission members were very positive and believed the Comp Plan was on target with the County's needs. Two residents spoke during the meeting. Allison Crews thought Industrial Hemp should be considered as an agricultural crop. Michael Whitaker thought the history of Amelia should be expanded as part of the Comp Plan.

David Whitaker asked that anyone with additional information they feel should be included in the Comp Plan to submit it within the next two weeks for consideration by the Comp Plan Committee. When the final Comp Plan is completed, there will be a Public Hearing to allow Amelia residents to speak in support or opposition on the plan. The Planning Commission will then make their recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.
