In 2016, nearly half of all infant fatalities in Virginia were related to unsafe sleep practices. In ongoing efforts to reduce this staggering number, the Virginia Department of Social Services will kick-off a special statewide campaign and call-to-action pledge, <u>Safe Sleep 365</u>. The campaign, which coincides with National Infant Safe Sleep Awareness Month in September and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) Awareness Month in October, emphasizes the core principles of "Alone, Apart and Always" to educate all Virginians on simple life-saving practices that will help ensure a safe and healthy environment for infants each time they sleep.

The Safe Sleep 365 campaign includes multi-layered mediums to educate parents and caregivers on the risk factors associated with SIDS as well as safe sleep practices that promote placing infants **ALONE** in a firm crib/bassinet or other safe sleep space, **APART** from people, toys, blankets, pillows or other items, and **ALWAYS** on his/her back in a drug- and alcohol- free environment.

Infant sleep-related deaths are preventable. Reducing the rate of preventable child fatalities throughout the Commonwealth continues to be a priority of our work as an agency.
